#### APRIL IS STANDARDIZED TEST MONTH The first 2 weeks of April

Grades 3-8 will take Arizona's Academic Standards Assessment – AASA. Our school will be doing paper/pencil testing for the AASA. Grades 5, 8, and 11 will take the Arizona Science Test - AzSCI

**Grade 11** will be taking the ACT Parts 1 and 2. Our school will be doing computer-based testing for the ACT.

**Grade 9** will be taking the ACTAspire. Our school will be doing computer-based testing for the ACTAspire.

Please make sure that you provide a healthy breakfast for your child during testing. We will still serve breakfast on test days but the café will close right at 8AM so that students can get to class on time to test. Students will be taking assessments in writing, reading and math for AASA. Alpha Society members must maintain passing scores and new students must pass these assessments to qualify for Alpha Society. Lunches will work on a modified schedule and students will not be able to get money from siblings during testing, make sure each student has their own lunch or lunch money.
